# What is Homelessness?

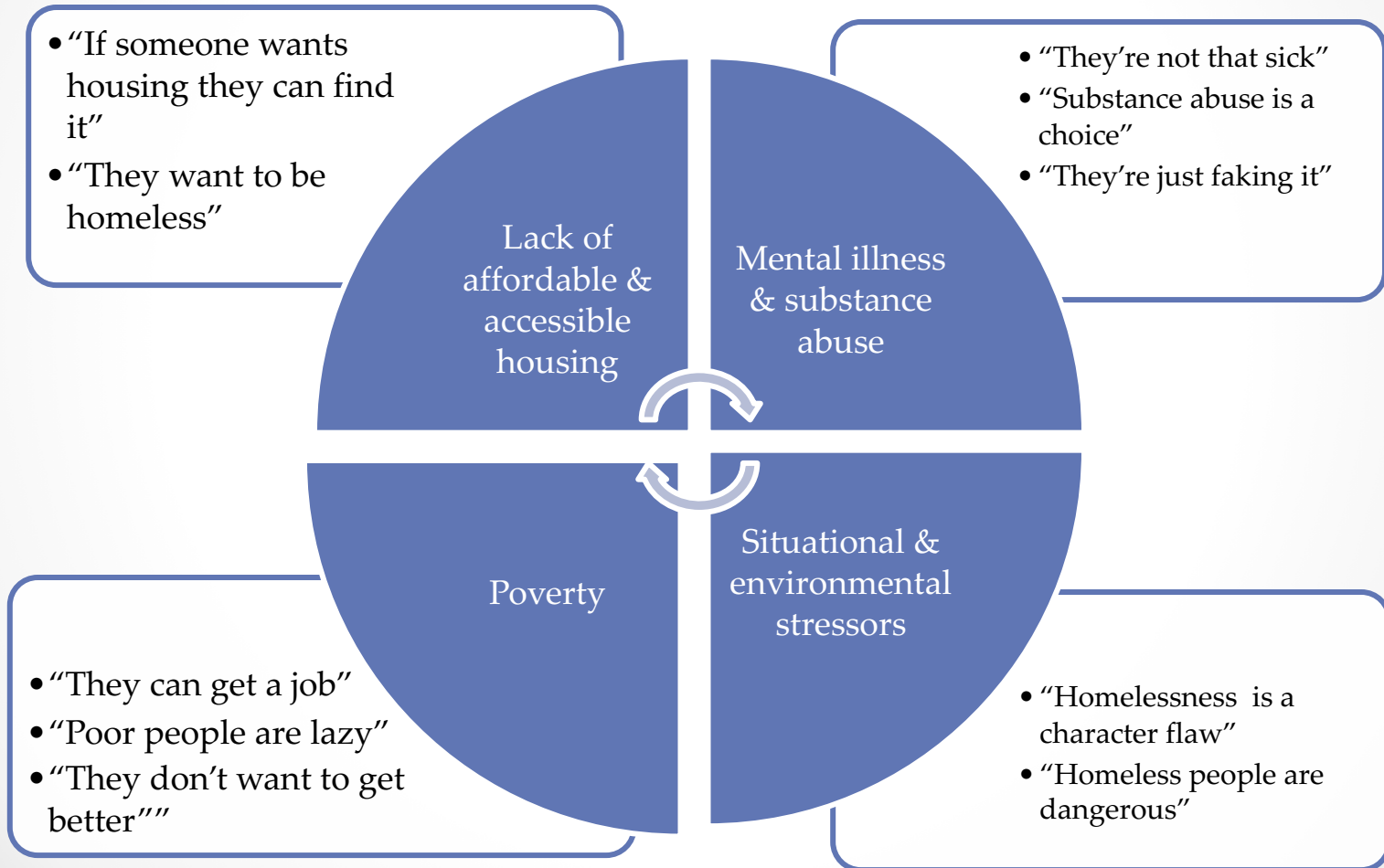
## HUD Programs

- People who are living in a place not meant for human habitation, in emergency shelters, in transitional housing, exiting an institution where temporarily resided, and fleeing domestic violence and no other residence or support.

## McKinney-Vento

- Homeless children or youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.

# South Carolina By the Numbers

## 2018 PIT Count

- 3,933 total persons
- 510 total children
- 686 chronically homeless
- 355 mental illness
- 260 substance abuse

## HMIS (CY 2017)

- 18,340 total persons
- 4,060 total children
- 1,896 chronically homeless
- 2,277 mental illness
- 1,115 substance abuse

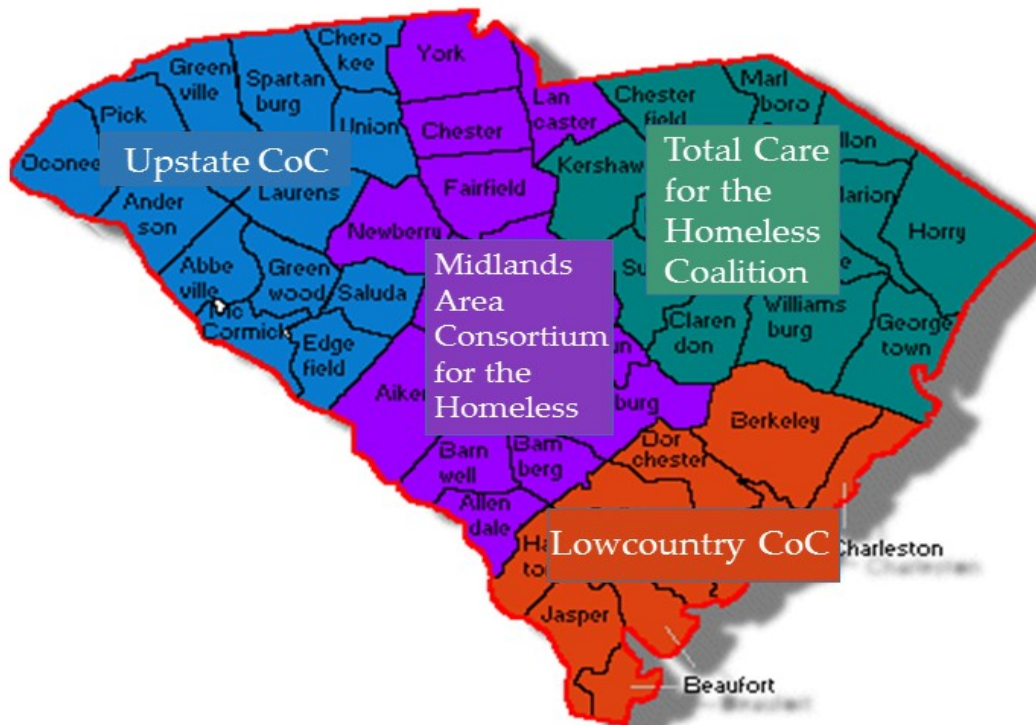
# HUD Continuum of Care (CoC)

## COMPONENTS OF AN EFFECTIVE HOUSING CRISIS Response System



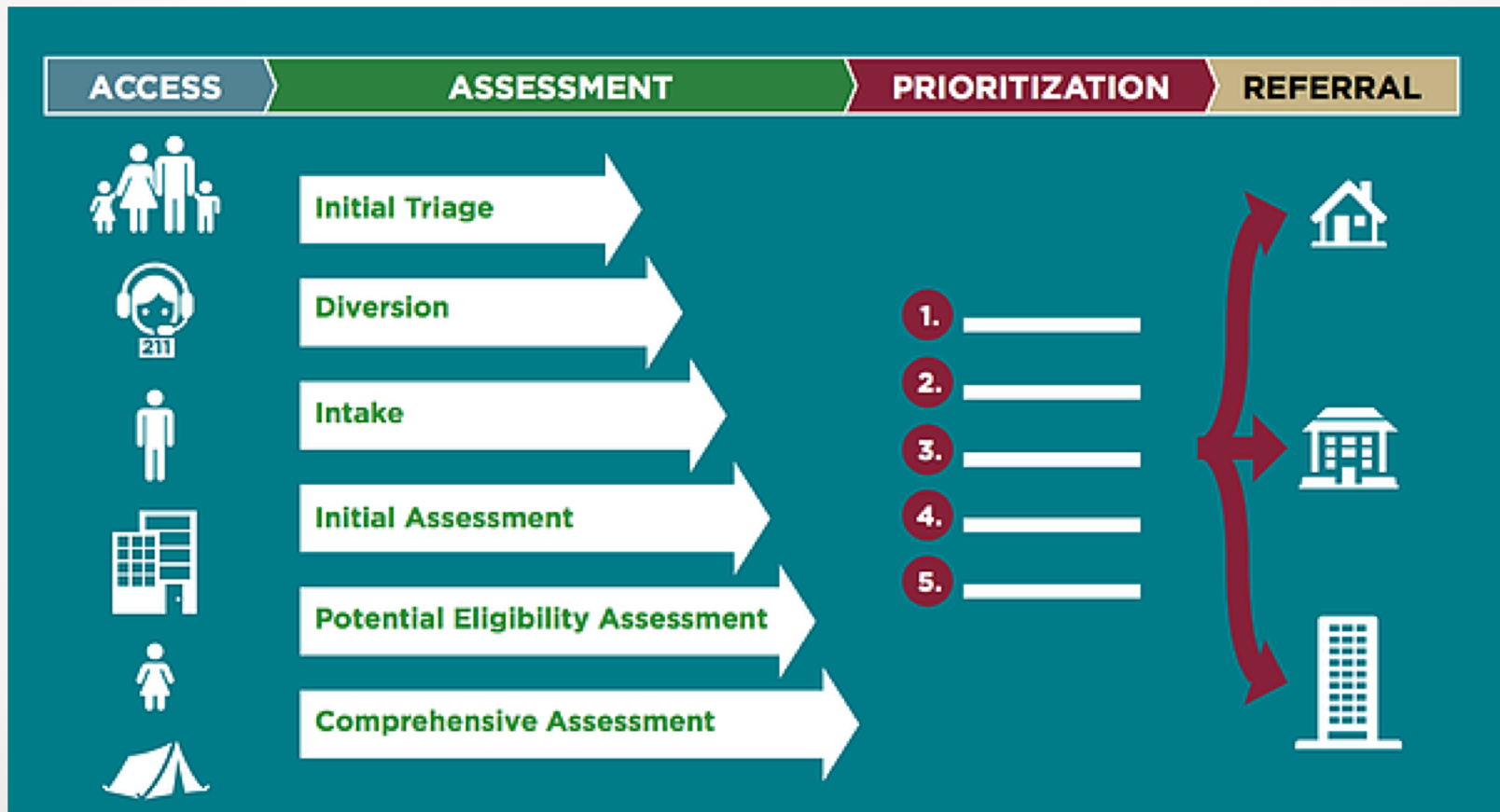

- Housing is an important social determinant of health

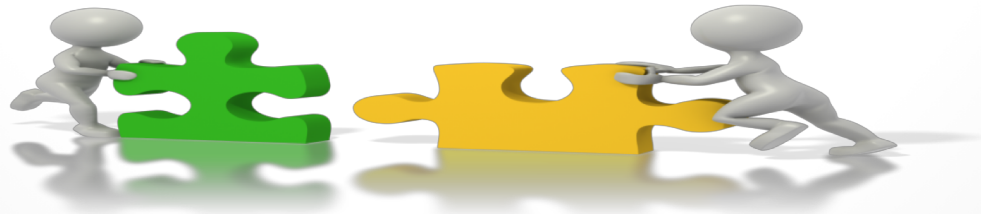
# How to Ask if Someone is Experiencing Homelessness

- Establish protocols for linking patients to local coordinated entry system
